Then Joseph . . . did as the angel of the Lord had bidden him

We spend 4 weeks in the solemn contemplation of the coming of Christ

Then we spend a short time in glorious celebration of His birth

But immediately thereafter,

we are given the example of St Stephen, the first martyr, Saint John, the Apostle and then the commemoration of the Holy Innocents, the children murdered by Herod in Bethlehem in a failed effort to extinguish the rise of Jesus.

It is a lot to assimilate in such a short time; An emotional roller coaster.

But today, the Gospel focuses on Joseph.

And we return to the Nativity Story
But from Joseph's perspective.

Joseph is something of an enigma.

He speaks not a word in the Bible
We know nothing about his life before his betrothal to Mary
And he vanishes without a trace and without fanfare
After the story of Jesus being lost
for three days when He was 12 years old.

Yet, Joseph was central to the life of Jesus.

And one of the reasons that Jesus survived childhood To be able to reach the Cross And our salvation.

Even before Jesus was born,

Joseph faced a life altering decision,

A crisis actually

Can we imagine the conversation between Joseph and Mary When she told him of the Child she carried?

Joseph knew he could be the father of the child. Could Mary's story of the Angel, the circumstances of the conception

The Fatherhood of the child

Be believed?

Could any man accept such a thing?

The consequences were life altering.

The embarrassment of it when family and friends found out.

The shame brought to Joseph's and Mary's family

The potential for prosecution

It was a prima facia case of adultery.

For which the sentence was death by stoning.

It would mean the death of Mary

And the death of the unborn Child.

There would be no Cross

No salvation for the world.

Joseph had few options.

He could renounce Mary for her infidelity

Essentially divorce her.

That would expose her adultery.

He could proceed as if the Child were his.

Do nothing.

Let people believe the Child was his.

That would expose both of them for immorality

But would save the life of the Child and Mary.

While contemplating his dilemma,

Joseph had the first of a number of dreams in which he was visited by an angel of God.

The Angel, Gabriel told Joseph not to fear taking Mary for his wife Further, the Son of God, would be named Jesus Yeshua in Hebrew Meaning "God Saves".

Joseph obeyed the instruction Saving the Christ Child, the first time but he would do so again.

He took Mary to Bethlehem

Where the days were accomplished And she brought forth a son, the Christ Child.

Fulfilling the prophecy

A virgin will conceive. He will be born in the City of David And be of the house and lineage of David.

Not long thereafter there was a new threat.

Herod ordered his troops
to kill all the children of two years or younger in the town of Bethlehem.

The Holy Family had to escape.

In yet another dream

Joseph was forewarned of the slaughter

And he took them to Egypt

to safety

Just as another Joseph and another dreamer

Was taken to Egypt for safety.

And as all the sons of Jacob fled a drought

To the safety of Egypt.

And so, Joseph saved the Christ Child a second time
This time from the murderous intentions of Herod.

In yet another dream the angel of the Lord appeared telling Joseph That it was safe to return to Judah.

Joseph took the Holy Family to Nazareth

Where they set up housekeeping to raise a family.

And Joseph fulfilled another prophecy

"and He shall be called a Nazarene".

Here Joseph supported the Family as a carpenter And taught the trade to Jesus That He would be self-sustaining and able to provide for Mary.

We catch our last glimpse of Joseph as he makes the annual trek to Jerusalem at the Passover.

Jesus is 12 years old now And already showing His prowess among the elders of the temple.

Then Joseph vanishes from scripture and from recorded history. The most important Step-Father ever.

We have learned a good deal about Joseph.

He is a man of God

Obedient to God's will.

Devout.

Observant of the Jewish customs and traditions; Every obligation of the faith.

He is a diligent worker and father.

Protector of the family

Supporter of the family.

He is a father to Jesus in every way but biologically A mentor. A teacher. A guide. An example.

Is it any wonder that our Roman Catholic cousins
Have named Joseph the patron saint of fatherhood?

We need Joseph and his example dearly today. Sociologists and psychologists tell us fatherhood is in steep decline in our society. We can only speculate as to the cause.

Today, 2 out of 5 children grow up without a father. Children without a father account for 90% of all homeless And runaway kids.

71% of the kids who drop out of high school did not have a father in their household.

63% of all youth suicide victims grew up without a father.

I was shocked to learn of a recent study that found some 90% of the men in US prisons grew up in a household that had no father.

Our Country has never been so desperate for fatherhood. It is clear that God's plan for us has been short-circuited. And we are living the consequences.

So the time has never been more right for a return to the character of a man like Joseph.

The Church has been pointing to his life Work and

Example

For over 500 years.

Can we hear it?
