and suddenly there came ... as of a rushing mighty wind and there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire and it sat upon each if them

We celebrate today

That mysterious

seminal event ... Pentecost.

With your indulgence let me answer a few of the questions That Pentecost evokes:

Pentecost has an AKA: "Whitsunday" in our Prayer Books White Sunday

You see in ancient times baptisms occurred in cycles
Baptisms were preceded by a time of adult instruction
And on the day, there were many adults to be baptized.

Pentecost became known as White Sunday

Or Whitsunday

Named after the sea of people wearing white gowns.

Not unlike little James Edward, today.

Annie Leonard now you see another reason I was so excited to receive your note about Baptizing James Edward on this day.

It could not be more appropriate.

Today James Edward received the Holy Spirit Just as the Apostles and the Church so long ago.

But the day is commemorated in red Red for the fire of God's love That St Luke wrote about.

The name Pentecost is derived from *pente*, an ancient Greek word meaning 5

It is 50 days since the Resurrection of our Lord.

The Jews celebrated Pentecost for centuries before we did.

For them it is 50 days since Passover and a major feast.

Pentecost is the third of the three days that our Canons

Require all good Christians to observe

By going to church

Yet, it has never achieved the attention of Christmas and Easter The other two days of obligation.

Pentecost celebrates the birth of the church

The historic occasion

When the 12 became the body of Christ, the church

But it is shrouded in mystery.

The accounts of what happened that day

Are limited by the human mind

And by human vocabulary

This overwhelming cosmic event

exceeded the ability of those present to put it into words.

So Luke tells us

It was <u>as of</u> a mighty rushing wind, and Cloven tongues. Like as of fire

Jesus had been talking about it for months

He told them that He would be put to death

But that He would not leave them comfortless

That He would send them the comforter.

But they could not comprehend how this beloved man

This Son of God

Could be put to death

Could leave them

And it seems as many times as He told them He would send the Comforter

They could not get past the fact of His being gone

And could not hear the part about the comforter

And in the days following His Ascension

They must have been lost

Bewildered

Leaderless

But He told them the comforter would come.

We need another of those "old English language" talks.

Comforter in 1611 was not the word that you and I know today.

The root of the word is "fort". Yep:

Just like the military building

Fortification, Fortress, like the forts we know here:

Ft Point, Ft Cronkite, Ft Baker, Ft Mason, Funston

A strong, impenetrable structure

High walls

For defense; protection.

So comfort was a strong fort, not a warm fuzzy quilt for your bed.

And the Comforter was of tremendous strength

To protect them, protect us.

Jesus told them what the comforter would do:

"When the Comforter is come

He will testify of me

And ye shall bear witness

Because you have been with me from the beginning".

He promised that the Comforter would always be with them

Will always be with us

The Comforter is the Holy Ghost, the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete

And is within almost everyone

Certainly every Christian

Every one of you. And now little James Edward too.

Jesus refers to the Comforter as a witness who shall testify;

Something of which this lawyer knows.

He will give testimony, tell us the truth

Just like a witness on the stand in court.

Who will remind or call to remembrance to the 12

Those things that Jesus had told them

Those things He had done

In the 3+ years they were together

And so it is with us.

Have you noticed times in your life

When,

A thought comes to mind

A recollection

A bit of scripture

An experience of long ago

Something that someone said

And all of a sudden

Some Christian principle

Some foggy, troubling concept of God

Becomes clear

Clear as though

It has been there all along?

My friends, that is the witness Jesus is talking about

That is the Holy Spirit working in your lives.

It is as if every now and again

The Holy Spirit

Sits you down

Selects and reorganizes what you have experienced

And shows you a truth

Now that you have lived a little

And are re-acquainted with it

It falls into place

And makes sense.

Reading scripture can be a bit like that

You pick up your Bible

Or you hear the Epistle or Gospel on a Sunday,

That you've read or heard a hundred times

But this time

There is some new understanding or meaning.

And you ask yourself: why didn't I see that before? Haven't we all had experiences like these?

It is said of scripture that the Holy Ghost

Breathes into the words of scripture as they are written And breathes them out to you as you read them.

We all know that the Holy Ghost is the third person of the Trinity

St Augustine said: the Holy Spirit is the love

That the Father and the Son realize between each other.

It is the spirit of Divine Love.

In eternity one either burns with the love of God

Or is burned by it.

And how perfectly fitting it was that

it was at the institution of that Divine Love

That the church was brought forth that day.

It was as of a might rushing wind

It was like as of cloven tongues of fire

You see the church was the creation of God

The apostles didn't call a meeting

Peter made a motion

James seconded it

That they form the church of Jesus Christ

All in favor say aye

It was the creation of God that day.

Instituted of divine love.

It marked a new beginning in history

A new life

A new power given to mankind.

The Holy Ghost is the source and giver of Grace.

That mysterious gift of God

That brings us closer to God.

It was on Pentecost Sunday in 1992, 33 years ago

before this miracle building was built,

Archbishop Morse said to the St Thomas congregation:

"In all situations that come to us in life

We can say

"All is Grace"

that the Holy Spirit will make all things good

in the fullness of His time.

Within the endless bounty of His love

that transcendent Spirit

was poured out upon the Church at Pentecost."

Morse often told us "All is Grace".

And as the Grace of the Holy Spirit

Was poured out upon the 12 that day.

Peter,

The fisherman

That seemingly uneducated oaf

Who lacked the filter to guard what he said

Who denied even knowing Jesus three times during His trial,

Walked out of that room in Jerusalem

And delivered one of the most eloquent, articulate

Moving and

Convincing sermons ever given

And when he was done

3000 people were baptized.

Such is the power of the Holy Spirit.

Such is the power of the love of God.

We see the evidence of the Holy Spirit Even if we cannot see it, itself

It seems that the Holy Spirit is not something or someone With us at birth.

We receive it only sacramentally.

We all know people in whom the Holy Spirit is strong And even if we can't quite articulate what we sense We know it is there.

The Holy Spirit is instituted in us at our baptism
And again at our confirmation
And for the clergy again
At the ordination of deacons
And again at the ordination of priests
I think we need the Holy Spirit to be replenished from time to time
A priest friend of mine once suggested that
We seem to have a leak.

For some tragic few, the Holy Spirit is never within them They can know nothing of the love of God Their lives are often a ruined, tragic, empty hulk

But for those in whom the Holy Spirit dwells and is strong, Life and love is full and rich. The love of life and the love of God Cannot be separated

In a moment we, as the Body of Christ, His Church
Will invoke God the Holy Spirit to descend
and consecrate this bread and wine
into the Sacrament of Our Lord's death and resurrection.
His body and blood,

The eternal transfixed in time.

When we are weak in spirit

In faith

Or in despair,

We are given the grace to live life unafraid

Through the power of the Holy Spirit.

We will tackle the Trinity next Sunday

Jesus is almost tangible for us, perhaps because He is fully human

And fully divine

God, less tangible

But the Holy Spirit seems entirely amorphous

And we have to spend time to consider

Who

Or what the Holy Spirit is.

I leave you this Pentecost Sunday with this thought:

It was by the Holy Spirit

By the love of God

That our church was born on this day

In that closed room in Jerusalem

All those thousands of miles and many years ago

And it is by the love of God

That the church has survived

and flourished over the centuries

Despite the onslaught brought against it.

Is it by the Love of God

That you are here today.

That you worship God

That you give Him of your time, talents and treasure?

What will you do with the Love of God today

To glorify Him

To reflect His love in your life

To be that living example

Of life lived in the love of God for all to see?

It is the Holy Spirit living in you and in me that will be our guide and witness.

All is Grace
