> Ye men of Galilee, Why stand ye gazing up into heaven?

They must have been bewildered.

Jesus had taken the Apostles a half-day's walk from Jerusalem, out to a hillside in Bethany.

He told them to go back to Jerusalem Where they would be endued with power from on high. As He blessed them, He was taken up Into the clouds To His post at the right hand of God. They lost sight of Him And would see Him no more.

But two men in white apparel appeared. They said: "Ye men of Galilee,

> Why stand ye gazing up in heaven? This same Jesus which is taken up from you into heaven, Shall so come in like manner, As ye have seen him go into heaven."

They must have stood there Silent Trying to comprehend what had just happened And what it would mean.

It had been only 40 days since His Crucifixion. There had been a whirlwind of activity. His Resurrection; the astonishing news swirling and sweeping not just Jerusalem but all Judea.

There were accounts of people sighting Him

in His resurrected body,

walking and talking among them.

Later, He had appeared before the Apostles, met them at the shores of the Sea of Galilee, He had even shared a meal with them. He kept telling them of something powerful coming.

And now this. What had just happened? Was it the conclusion or the beginning And what was to come?

Jesus had told them He would go home to the Father. Could they take it in? Even after they had witnessed it Could they comprehend what it meant?

As far back as the story of Daniel

The Ascension had been foretold. Some 500 years before, Daniel wrote of his vision from heaven:

"behold, one like the Son of man came with the clouds of heaven, and came to the Ancient of days and they brought him near before him. And there was given him dominion and glory and the kingdom, that all people, nations, and languages should serve him: this dominion, which shall not pass away and the kingdom that which shall not be destroyed." It would be some time before scholars could put it all together. The enigmatic writings of Daniel had been meaningless; Until the Ascension. Daniel's vision was of Jesus ascending to heaven In return to the Father, His earthly mission completed. And then Daniel's words finally made sense. Jesus had dominion, glory and the Kingdom That all peoples, nations and all languages Would serve Him. Forever.

The Creeds boldly state the matter; "He ascended into heaven and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty."

That reference to "the right hand of God" May hold the key for us today.

Perhaps a reference to the preference of seating at the banquet table,

The seat to the right of the host is the honored one. The one saved for the special guest.

However, I think there is even more significance.

Daniel relates that He was given dominion, a Kingdom. Something foreign to our ears. But familiar and commonplace to the ancients.

Jesus is King of His Kingdom.

That is why the hymns selected today sound of Coronation Diadem Royal state Jesus returned to His Father as King Ruler of all, Omnipotent, Omniscient, Eternal.

His Ascension has one more important aspect: He demonstrates there is a Heaven. Perhaps not a place as we know it, But certainly an existence.

He spoke of it to the Apostles.

He told them He was leaving this earth

And would go to the Father.

When Thomas questioned Him, He said (ever a servant):

"I go to prepare a place for you."

So our King awaits us.

A King in state just as He was when He Ascended; Fully human and fully divine.
A King who knows what it is like to be human in this world.
A King who knows suffering and solace.
Joy and despondency.
Triumph and tragedy.
A King who will be our Judge at the end of time.

We have the perfection of Heaven in our sights A life goal An eternal reward.

We have to feel for those who do not share what we have. Those who deny Him Deny the existence of heaven Who live this life without purpose Empty and without hope. Doesn't life take on a completely different meaning to those for whom death is still final?

Maybe you can tell them this little parable that might give them pause:

In their mothers womb are twin babies The first asks "Do you believe in life after delivery? The second replied: "why, of course.

There has to be something after delivery

Maybe we are here to prepare ourselves for what will be after Nonsense says the first

There is no life after delivery. What could that life possibly be I don't know, but there will be more light than in here

Maybe we will walk on our legs and eat with our mouths The doubter laughed: "that is absurd! Walking is impossible

And eating with our mouths? Ridiculous.

The umbilical cord supplies all our needs

Life after delivery just can't be.

The umbilical cord is too short

The second held his ground

I think there is something and maybe it's different than it is here

The first replied: "no one has ever come back from there Delivery is the end of life

And in after-delivery there is nothing but darkness

Well I don't know said the twin "but certainly we will see mother And she will take care of us.

Mother?

You believe in Mother? The first baby scoffed.

Where is she now?

The second calmly tried to explain

"she is all around us" It is in her that we live.

Without her there would be no life.

Well . . . I don't see her. . . so she does not exist.

To which the other replied: Sometimes when you're in silence

You can hear her, you can perceive her. I believe there is even a greater life after delivery

And we are here to prepare ourselves for that reality when it comes.'

The short and fleeting time that we have here on this planet This island In the universe Is but a miniscule portion of our journey.
